


Hospital Engagement Network Update: HEN 2.0

During the initial *Partnership for Patients* campaign, Indiana hospitals made tremendous progress preventing at least 4,690 harms, saving the state \$22,340,000. The excitement and energy continues with the potential of HEN 2.0. IHA plans to continue partnering with the American Hospital Association's Health Research and Educational Trust (AHA/HRET) to drive this work.

What are the focus areas of HEN 2.0?

What does participation in HEN 2.0 provide?



What are the requirements to join HEN 2.0?

1. Sign commitment letter by the CEO and Quality lead when the HEN 2.0 contract begins
2. Agree to submit monthly data for each of the topic areas applicable to your hospital
3. Participate actively in the resources available, and utilize the resources and tools to drive improvement in all topics
4. CMS aims for **100%** of acute care hospitals to participate in a HEN
 - Hospitals may only join one HEN and any hospital may join IHA and the HRET HEN, regardless of what HEN they participated with previously

What data measures must I report?

Data measures will be aligned with commonly reported nationally standardized measures. For example, infection (CAUTI, CLABSI, SSI, VAE and C. diff) data measures will be the same standard measures that your hospital reports to the National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN). IHA will continue to provide assistance with data available from the Inpatient Discharge Study (IDS).

When will HEN 2.0 begin?

AHA/HRET must first be awarded a HEN 2.0 contract from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). HEN 2.0 will begin once funding is secured. The projected start of the project is summer 2015.

How can your hospital get started now?

- Express interest to IHA; formal commitment letters will follow after the contract is awarded to AHA/HRET
- Continue to collect monthly data for aligned measures – HRET’s CDS remains open for data entry through May 31
- Confer rights in NHSN to the IHA user’s group
- Engage in your Regional Patient Safety Coalition to share improvement stories, network with peers and become involved with regional improvement projects
